RAGC0220GA is a wide band low noise amplifier with a frequency range of 2 to 20GHz.

The power output of this amplifier is 21 dBm typical. The typical gain is 18dB with a flatness of  $\pm 0.5$ dB.

The working temperature of this product is between - 40°C and + 85°C.

#### **Bias Up Procedure**

- 1. Connect ground
- 2. Connect input and output with 50 Ohm source/load. (In band VSWR < 1.9:1 or >10dB return loss.)
- 3. Connect positive supply and make sure power supply can handle max current.

#### **Bias Down Procedure**

- 1. Turn off power supply and remove positive supply
- 2. Disconnect input and output with 50 Ohm source/load. (In band VSWR < 1.9:1 or >10dB return loss.)
- 3. Remove ground


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


# Gain@+25℃




# Input VSWR@+25℃




## Output VSWR@+25°C




# Isolation@+25℃



# Gain@-40°C








# Output VSWR@+85℃








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
#### Gain vs. Output Power




# Gain vs. Control Voltage




## P1dB vs. Frequency




Saturation Power vs. Frequency

## Noise Figure(2GHz-4GHz)




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
# Noise Figure(4GHz-20GHz)



# Pout vs. Pin




#### **Current vs. Pout**

#### **Amplifier Use**

Ensure that the amplifier input and output ports are safely terminated into a proper 50 ohm load before turning on the power. Never operate the amplifier without a load. A proper 50 ohm load is defined as a load with impedance less than 1.9:1 or return loss larger than 10dB relative to 50 Ohm within the specified operating band width.

#### Power Supply Requirements

Power supply must be able to provide adequate current for the amplifier. Power supply should be able to provide 1.5 times the typical current or 1.2 times the maximum current (whichever is greater).

In most cases, RF - Lambda amplifiers will withstand severe mismatches without damage. However, operation with poor loads is discouraged. If prolonged operation with poor or unknown loads is expected, an external device such as an isolator or circulator should be used to protect the amplifier.

Ensure that the power is off when connecting or disconnecting the input or output of the amp.

Prevent overdriving the amplifier. Do not exceed the recommended input power level.

Adequate heat-sinking required for RF amplifier modules. Please inquire.

Amplifiers do not contain Thermal protection, Reverse DC polarity or Over voltage protection with the exception of a few models. Please inquire.

Proper electrostatic discharge (ESD) precautions are recommended to avoid performance degradation or loss of functionality.

What is not covered with warranty?

Each RF - Lambda amplifier will go through power and temperature stress testing.

Since the die, ICs or MMICs are fragile, these are not covered by warranty. Any damage to these will NOT be free to repair.
